## DISTRICT COACHES SCORE IN TRAINING – ATHLETES TO BE THE WINNERS!

Legendary Coach John Wooden *lived it...*

Olympic Team USA *modeled it...*

35 Local coaches and support staff *believe in it...*

Student athletes will *learn it...*



"It" is....*Pursuing Victory with Honor*, an exciting sportsmanship initiative that uses the extraordinary power of sports to mold and strengthen the character of student athletes. In fact, the program is a direct offshoot of the *Character Counts!* program already being implemented in our schools district-wide.



On June 2nd of this year, 35 head and assistant coaches and grant staff were trained in the *Pursuing Victory with Honor* program under the auspices of the Josephson Institute's Center for Sports Ethics, and led by Dr. Harold Slemmer, Executive Director of the Arizona Interscholastic Association. Not only is Dr. Slemmer a former coach, he is a high school principal and part-time instructor at Northern Arizona University and Arizona State University, teaching graduate courses in educational leadership.

The program, an extension of Coach John Wooden's personal and professional philosophy (he also was a dedicated sponsor of the program), is endorsed by virtually every major amateur athletic organization. It instructs coaches, teachers, administrators, and parents

to use sports as a vehicle for developing strong sportsmanship through character building and teaching young athletes how to achieve victory through honor. The program focuses on assisting them to develop life skills and values like integrity, perseverance, sacrifice, respect, and responsibility.

It develops the whole player so these values will remain throughout their lives.

Staffers say the coaches came out of the training "inspired and excited" to integrate the program into all El Rancho High School athletic disciplines. With this fire-in-the-belly enthusiasm, teachers and coaches hope to incorporate the program into their own staff meetings concerning leadership roles. According to ERHS assistant principal, Steve Rodriguez, varsity coaches will be picking up the pace of the PVWH program by "forming their own S.W.A.T. (School Wide Action Teams) group, meeting monthly to map out plans for best utilizing the guidelines offered by the program." Lorraine Jimenez, the grant's evidence-based program facilitator, says involving the athletes' parents through workshops each new athletic season will go far in "promoting a positive atmosphere throughout the school campus."

It's an exciting prospect for high school athletes, coaches, and students. In the words of Michael Josephson, founder of the Ethics Institute:


